



1. **Project Name:** **WASH Assistance for Rohingya (FDMN) and Host Community at Teknaf Upazila Project, Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh.**
2. **Project Duration:** **01<sup>st</sup> July, 2021 to 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2021**
3. **Implementing Area:** Camp-24, block-G & camp-27, block-A and surrounding host community Hnila Union, ward # 3,5,8 and 9, Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh.
4. **Donor name:** The German Federal Foreign Office (GFFO) and **Welthungerhilfe (WHH)- Germany,**
5. **Total budget of the project:** **BDT: 3,84,45,200/- [Euro: 384,452.00, USD: 468,844.00]**

**6. Project Summary:**

It is the aim of the project to ensure for all refugees living in camps 24 block G and 27 block A and for the affected host communities:

- regular, sufficient, equitable and dignified access to safe water for drinking and domestic needs;
- adequate, appropriate and acceptable sanitation facilities (including household waste);
- change of potentially dangerous behaviors through innovative hygiene promotion (including hygiene items).

Under Output 1: Will be distributed 2000 waste containers, 150 waste collection points set up and waste collection organized, latrines dislodged and rehabilitated, two solid waste management plants, and two fecal sludge plants established. Furthermore, 170 improved toilets, 170 bathing cubicles, 184 handwashing stations will be constructed, 180 solar lights installed, and maintenance and operation of the WASH infrastructure ensured by 15 trained volunteers and 6 WASH maintenance groups.

Under Output 2: intends to ensure access to safe drinking water in camps by establishing operation and maintenance of 7 water supply schemes, distributing 3000 water storage containers to households, and rehabilitating two water pumps.

Output 3: Aims at improving hygiene practices of the target groups. The distribution of 2500 hygiene kits and menstrual hygiene kits will be combined with 880 hygiene promotion sessions including information, education, and communication (IEC)-material and training of 60 volunteers.

7. **Goal of the Project:** The overall objective is to contribute to the improvement of the living conditions and access to critically needed WASH services for the Rohingya Refugee and vulnerable Host Communities in Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh.

## **8. Major objectives/Outputs:**

1. Critically needed WASH infrastructure and Services are established and maintained in the camps and partly in the host community.
2. Access to safe drinking water in camps is ensured.
3. Hygiene practices of the target group have improved.

## **9. Major Activities: (Including description and a Picture):**

### *Major activities under output 1:*

- 1.1: Waste collection (provision of bins, establishment of collection points, organized collection – in camp only)
- 1.2: Operating solid waste management plant (Segregation, recycling, and composting – in camp and host community)
- 1.3: Fecal sludge management FSM (Desludging and rehabilitation of latrines in camps only)
- 1.4: Construction/ rehabilitation and operating of fecal sludge plan (in camp and host community)
- 1.5: Maintenance & Operating of WASH facilities (Hand washing satiation & bathing cubicles, drainage channels, etc. – in camps only)
- 1.6: Construction/Replacement of WASH infrastructure (mainly for camp-24)
- 1.7: Upgrade of WASH maintenance to meet protection standards (Lights, locks in camps only)
- 1.8: Establishment of WASH maintenance groups (in camp only)

### *Major activities under output 2:*

- 2.1: Operation and maintenance of Water supply schemes including chlorination of water, also for emergency response.
- 2.2: Provide HH level water storage.
- 2.3: Rehabilitation of water pumps

### *Major activities under output 3:*

- 3.1: Realization of hygiene promotion
- 3.2: Distribution of hygiene kits and menstrual hygiene kits

## **10. Impact of the Project (as of March 2021):**

- Proportion of HHs that have equitable and affordable access to enough safe water to meet their drinking and domestic needs has been improved from the baseline report 25% to 57%.
- Percentage of households with access to a designated neighborhood or communal solid waste collection point at an acceptable distance from their dwelling has been increased from the baseline report 39% to 65%.
- Percentage of HHs hygiene practices has been increased from the baseline report 48% to 70%.
- Percentage of latrines reported safe to access by females in terms of lighting and locks has been increased from the baseline report 41% to 55%.
